A WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

As I begin my tenure as the Chairman of the Lumber River Council of Governments (LRCOG) Board of Directors, I am proud to present the annual report for fiscal year 2023-2024. This year's annual report demonstrates the exceptional value of continuing collaboration, partnership, teamwork, and dedication that the LRCOG brings to all of its member governments and the entire population of the region.

Among the prime examples of the value and success that the LRCOG has brought to our region over the past year is the acquisition of almost \$1,000,000 to help support broadband access and education, 48 individuals trained in FEMA public assistance, and over 60 projects submitted



for consideration in the North Carolina State Transportation Improvement Plan. The Workforce Development Division has provided over 300 individuals with occupational skills support as well as on-the-job and work experience training for almost 80 of our region's job seekers. Finally, the Aging Division has saved our region's older adults almost \$350,000 on their prescription drug plans, while providing them almost 175,000 nutritious meals allowing the region's growing older adult population to age in the place of their choice.

The LRCOG is truly a unique place where we are able to bring together subject matter experts in workforce development, transportation, aging, local government services and many other areas to enable our individual communities and region as a whole to prepare for a bright and successful future.
